We are confident that 2021-22 has made us believe that nothing is impossible and has helped us raise the bar in the field of education for ourselves.

## Here is a snapshot of our work through this year:

- A sneak peek into Gateway's Career Path Programme, a 3-year programme to support our young adults to transition into the community through exposure and rigorous practice in life skills, functional skills, and job skills.
- Launched our culinary programme in our very own kitchen at Gateway. We hope to grow this into our own cafe.
- Partnered with professionals in the US to build our in-house speech and language programme. We piloted the oro-motor and therapeutic listening programme this year and will continue to grow them in the coming years.
- Collaborated with our partner schools and external professionals to conduct groundbreaking research on FABLe, our in-house reading fluency mobile application.
- Partnered with the Tata Institute of Social Sciences on a project supported by the Cognizant Foundation to build awareness and resources for inclusive education.



# **HIGHLIGHTS FROM 2021-22**

### **CAREER PATH PROGRAMME**

The Career Path Programme launched this year is a 3-year programme that supports our neurodiverse young adults to transition into the community. It focuses on life skills, functional skills, and job skills to enable our learners to navigate the community with independence. Our programme encourages learners to discover what they are passionate about and chart their own path. The outcomes are customised jobs for the learners identified through their skills, strengths, interests, and matching their profiles with employers with similar needs.

The Career Path Programme offers the Award Scheme Development and Accreditation Network (ASDAN) certification, a UK-based program. They offer imaginative ways of developing, recording, and certifying our learners' achievements in life skills, and job readiness.







# **HIGHLIGHTS FROM 2021-22**

### **CULINARY PROGRAMME**

This year we launched the culinary programme in our very own kitchen. ADL (Activities for Daily Living) skills + fun and tasty stuff!









### **SPEECH AND LANGUAGE PROGRAMME**

The Speech and Language team initiated the oromotor and myofascial therapy programme in school. This programme is focused on developing successful eaters and communicators in the classroom by working on feeding, chewing, oromotor skills and speech clarity. We are in collaboration with Jenifer Midili who has worked in the field of speech and language pathology for 25 years practicing in Virginia USA. We have seen a lot of success with the programme.

Our speech and language therapists along with the sensory motor team have also piloted the Therapeutic Listening Program in school. Therapeutic Listening is an evidence based auditory intervention program intended to support individuals who experience challenges with sensory processing dysfunction, listening, attention and communication. We are beginning to see positive changes and have also received positive feedback from parents regarding the program.

# **HIGHLIGHTS FROM 2021-22**

### LOWER AND MIDDLE SCHOOL SHOWCASE

Our lower and middle school annual showcase, 'My Voice, My Choice', was a collaboration between the students, speech therapists, and arts team. It was an opportunity for our students to display the speaking and listening skills that they learned in their therapy classes which in turn were generalized into a real-life setting. The showcase brought together stories of four prominent personalities - Lewis Carroll, King George VI, Marilyn Monroe, and Stephen Hawking - who struggled with speech difficulties throughout their lives but were able to persevere and overcome their challenges to find an effective way to communicate with the world





## ${\bf STUDENT\ AGENCY} > {\bf CREATING\ OUR\ OWN\ STUDENT\ COUNCIL}$

Multi-disciplinary learning units were developed at Gateway primarily to provide a holistic, appropriate and relevant curriculum to our population of students. The intention is that the outcome of each unit should be action oriented and connected to students lives. This past year, while learning about the principles of democratic governance in general, and specifically about the constitution of India, the students decided to appeal to the leadership at Gateway School about creating a student council. This was the result of an analysis about diverse representation, including the voices of not only leadership and teachers but also students. Students prepared speeches, listened to their peers, and voted for class representatives. Next year, the student council will be initiated and active.

# PARENT PARTNERSHIP

At Gateway, parents and families work together with our team towards the common goal of serving our students. This year aside from the specific partnerships below, our Parent-Teacher Association (PTA) has been tremendously helpful in supporting with a smooth transition back to face-to-face school - we know we couldn't have done this without the support of our PTA and every single parent at Gateway!



### **WORLD READ ALOUD DAY**

Language Art week was celebrated with hybrid events with guests joining us online and some of our students back in school, the first week of February. Some of our parents (Maruti, Purnima, Archana, Nidhi) conducted some fascinating storytelling sessions for our children on World Read Aloud Day. It was most interesting to hear our students connect and interact in their own unique ways. Aruna Shetty also conducted a lively Musical session for our Lower school. We look forward to welcoming our parents to participate in person (face to face) the following year!

### PARENT SUPPORT GROUP

PSG has been a space for parents to come together and build a community of support by bonding socially and emotionally. This year the PSG space had the opportunity to hear from our alumni parents. We had our alumni parents Jayshree, Tejal, Archana conduct sessions on topics like self-care and communication. While the virtual PSG sessions only allowed us to have an alternate way to connect, the transition back to face to face PSG in the month of February was greeted warmly.



### **ORO-MOTOR**

The oro-motor and feeding program initiated by the ST team was piloted during the pandemic when learning at Gateway was virtual and later when students would wear masks to school. Hence this program required a complete partnership between the therapist and the Parent where the therapist and the parents would co-conduct sessions. The therapist would train the parents to deliver the program within the home setting and regularly follow up with the therapist on progress that the child made and also how to modify the program as per the child's needs. This allowed the parents to not only see growth and changes due to the program but also helped them get a better understanding of their child's struggle and how to support him/her

Our team members continue to strive for excellence by enrolling in virtual workshops, webinars and MOOCs. 40% of our team members participated in school Outreach and R&D activities including mentoring and coaching external professionals; conducting workshops; and driving innovation as part of in-house task forces and the R&D team.



## **BOOK CLUB**

Our book club community continues to grow. This year we completed 3 books. We had between 30 and 70 people sign up for each book, with over 67% of sign-ups from external professionals.

### **INTERNS AT GATEWAY**

This year we had 22 interns join us from many organisations such as TISS, Hashu Advani, SNDT, University of the Arts London and many other institutions both from within and outside India. We started with an online model but successfully transitioned to a face to face model. Having Interns work with us is a wonderful learning opportunity for us as they bring fresh perspectives and new ideas. It has been an enriching experience for both our Interns as well as our Team. We have successfully hired some of our Interns and are happy to have them join our Team. The Internship Program is a wonderful learning experience for us all!


We also co-developed curriculum for two Masters level courses on Inclusive and special education that will be offered at TISS and other Universities.


